

GÜNTHER FÖRG, LE MODERNE — MAISON LA ROCHE — 16 OCTOBER - 14 DECEMBER

The Fondation Le Corbusier and Almine Rech are pleased to present Le Moderne, a retrospective exhibition of the work of Günther Förg at the Maison La Roche.

Born in 1952 in Germany, Förg trained at the Munich Academy of Fine Arts, where he was influenced by Blinky Palermo. He first became interested in monochrome paintings in black and grey, the basis of the conceptualism to which he remained attached throughout his life.

After his first monochrome paintings, Förg continued his research into modernist themes, which he explored from postmodern angles, using mainly painting, but also sculpture, ceramics and photography (large formats capturing architectural pieces ranging from the Bauhaus to Brutalism). His work has been exhibited in prestigious institutions such as the Museum of Modern Art in San Francisco, the Musée d'Art Moderne in Paris, the Museo Reina Sofía in Madrid and the Fondation Beyeler in Basel.



CENTENARY OF THE ATELIER DU 35 RUE DE SÈVRES & XXII^{ème} RENCONTRES DE LA FONDATION

On 18 September 1924, Le Corbusier set up his architectural studio at 35 rue de Sèvres in Paris, where he and his cousin Pierre Jeanneret took over the first floor of a former Jesuit convent in St-Germain-des-Prés, right next to the church of Sainte-Ignace.

For just over 40 years, this cosmopolitan agency welcomed several hundred young architects, men and women, from different countries and backgrounds. We will continue the celebration of the studio's centenary at the XXII Rencontres de la Fondation, which will be devoted to this unique place of creation.

The November newsletter will present the final programme of this international symposium, scheduled for 5 and 6 December at 35 rue de Sèvres.


CYRIL BRULÉ ET CHRISTELLE LECOEUR, LE SEXTANT, MAISON DE VACANCES LE CORBUSIER ET PIERRE JEANNERET AUX MATHES

This book provides a chronological and analytical presentation of this villa, built between 1934 and 1935 using local and traditional materials (wood and stone). It is the embodiment of the low-cost houses conceived by Le Corbusier since the 1920s.



DIDIER TEISSONNIÈRE, 35 S, L'ATELIER DE LE CORBUSIER

Drawing on a wealth of previously unpublished images and testimonials from former employees, this book provides a detailed account of the life of this emblematic site, from its creation to its destruction. With the help of numerous period photographs, it reconstructs its layout and successive occupations, while also evoking the incredible human adventure of the 35 S.



RESTAURATIONS

As part of a partnership with the École supérieure d'art et de design TALM in Tours, which trains future conservators-restorers of cultural property, four students took par in a work camp from 2 to 6 September at the Maison La Roche. The aim of the project was to carry out preventive conservation work, as well as treating and cleaning the original floor of the mezzanine, made of natural rubber in 1927. The work was supervised by Julia Becker, a teacher in the conservation-restoration of cultural property specialism, Eleonora Pelizzi, a research engineer in physics and chemistry and a scientific teacher in the conservation-restoration of cultural property specialism (BnF ESPyON project) and Isabelle Cuoco, a conservator-restorer specialising in modern and contemporary materials.









REPLACING THE PAULOWNIA TREE AT VILLA 'LE LAC

At the end of the summer, the paulownia, the iconic tree of the villa 'Le Lac', was replaced after a suitable soil treatment. The original tree, planted in 1924, had already been replaced in 2013.

It was with great sadness that we learned of the death of Philippe Duboÿ. He was an architect and art historian who taught at the Istituto Universitario di Architettura di Venezia, then in Nantes, before moving on to the École Nationale d'architecture de Paris-Belleville, Saint-Etienne, Lyon and Paris-La Villette.

His doctoral thesis led to a major publication on Jean-Jacques Lequeu, while his other research interests included Carlo Scarpa, Marcel Duchamp, Walter Benjamin and, more recently, Clotilde and Bernard Barto.

In our view, he remains an important member of the Corbusier community, not only through his militant teaching but also through his many contributions, articles, lectures and books, including his re-edition of Aircraft, an anthology of Le Corbusier's travel writings, and his fascinating work on Le Corbusier's readings at the Bibliothèque nationale and La Construction des villes.
